SAFER: Schools Act For Equal Rights

Where and when:

Part I: 5th – 11th of May 2019, in Villa Elba, Kokkola, Finland (5 training days)

Part II: 5th – 9th of November 2019, in Ljubljana, Slovenia (3 training days)

Course description: The course provides the participants with new, practical methods and tools to tackle hate speech, racism and other forms of discrimination in a school setting. The SAFER course focuses on the school culture and environment, giving the teachers skills and competences to be able to create safer spaces, build equality and introduce antiracist practices in their work. The course is suitable for all teachers from early childhood education and care to upper secondary education. In addition to the trainings, the participants will get access to a web course, a tool kit of methods and tools, and support from a local mentor trained to tackle hate speech and discrimination in schools.

The course is free for participants and includes training materials, accommodation, food and travel costs. Each participant is responsible to take care of travel insurance for themselves.

The objectives of the SAFER course:

- Introduce innovative co-creative approaches for dealing constructively with issues of hate speech, discrimination and racism in school.
- Finding tools how teachers can create safer space for social transformation in schools.
- To empower teachers to recognize, manage and transform hate speech in school.
- Find tools to support safety and wellbeing of minority students.
- Deepening the knowledge about discrimination and transforming schools (theory and sharing good practices).
- Key concepts: hate speech, discrimination, antiracism, intersectionality, transforming schools, safer space, equality, co-operative work & participatory methods.

Participants:

Teams of two motivated teachers/support specialists from Estonian schools who want to learn new tools, skills and competences to tackle hate speech and racist or discriminatory bullying in schools. The training is in English with trainers and participants from Estonia, Finland and Slovenia. The participants are required to take part in both parts of the training (in May and November 2019). They need to be able to travel to Finland in May and to Slovenia for the second part of the training in November.
