PEACE EDUCATION SUMMER SCHOOL FOR TEACHERS AND YOUTH WORKERS

Where and when: The three-day training will take place in Päivölä Recreation Centre in Vihti, Finland on **5th – 7th of June 2019**. The participants are required to arrive on **Tuesday 4th** and leave on **Saturday 8th of June**. Accommodation and meals provided from Tuesday night till Saturday morning.

Participants: Motivated teachers and youth workers from Finland, Estonia and Latvia who want to reflect on their work and professional challenges. Participants will learn new peace education approaches and methods that can easily be replicated in their school or youth work. The course is in English, so the participants are required to have English skills to participate meaningfully.

Participation fee: 100 € for Finnish participants and 50 € for Estonian and Latvian participants. The fee includes training materials, accommodation for four nights, food and transportation costs. Each participant is responsible to take care of travel insurance for themselves.

Course description: In the 3-day-training for teachers and youth workers from Estonia, Latvia and Finland Peace Education Institute and NGO Mondo will provide



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safe and relaxing space for reflecting professional approaches, engaging in mutual learning and exchanging experiences. The training will focus on providing the trainers new peace education methods and approaches that can be used in school and in youth work.
